Types of Occurrences requested to report by aircraft owner / operator:

Incident – means an occurrence, other than an accident, associated with the operation of an aircraft which affects or could affect the safety of operation.

Serious incident – means an incident involving circumstances indicating that there was a high probability of an accident and is associated with the operation of an aircraft.

Accident – means an occurrence associated with the operation of an aircraft, in which damage to the aircraft occurred and/or a person is injured or fatally injured as a result of:

- Being in the aircraft, or
- Direct contact with any part of the aircraft including detached parts.
